On Christmas Eve, in 1784, 60 lay preachers met with Thomas Coke and Francis Asbury in Baltimore, Maryland. The two men were elected, ordained and consecrated Bishops by this Christmas Conference. John Wesley had sent a liturgy and doctrinal statement for the occasion, and The Methodist Episcopal Church in America was formally established.
